


# What have we been up to this term?


#### **Local History week**

The school celebrated local history week by exploring history in and around Uphill Village.




Our youngest children looked at maps and photos to see how Uphill had changed over time. Year 2 looked at the work of George Muller and investigated how Uphill Grange has been used over time.

Year 3/4 looked at the use of animals around the village thinking about the way in which farming has shaped our village and Year 5/6 explored smuggling, why it happened and what was the impact of it on the village.

# What have we been up to this term?

#### **Rainbow, Sunshine & Saturn Class News**

This term our enquiry question was 'How do living things survive?' The learning was all about animals and plants. To help bring their learning to life the children went on a trip to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm seeing many exotic animals of Africa & Asia. They took part in a 'creatures features' workshop, where the children were able to stroke a snake and hold some other insects and there was some real

courage shown by many of the children!



Later in the term, they received a visit from Puxton Park who also bought some animals for the children to meet. As scientists they researched and found out animal facts, including where animals live (habitats), features of animals, what they eat and interesting facts about them. They finished their enquiry by showcasing their learning to their parents.

There was some fantastic learning and activities going on in EYFS & Year 1 this term! Well done everyone.

#### **Jupiter & Pluto Class News**

Year 2 were scientists and geographers this term with an enquiry question of 'How is the environment changing?' specifically looking at how this is affecting the animals in our world.

They learned about endangered habitats and endangered animals and the impact that humans have on these. They discovered that some of the main reasons for habitat loss are: deforestation, climate change and pollution. They recognised that these are big issues so they thought about ways in which they could make small changes in school, at home and in the local community to make a difference. These changes included: recycling, walking instead of using a car, turning off electrical appliances when they are not being used and planting wildflowers.

#### Sputnik, Chandra & Voyager Class News

What a wonderful time the Year 4's had on their residential trip to Folly Farm! There was never a dull moment and they were so lucky with the weather. Well done to all the children that came on camp, their behaviour was exemplary and your enthusiasm infectious; you are a credit to Uphill Village Academy.

Year 3/4 became geographers for our enquiry question 'Where in the world is the Amazon?' They have learned to use atlases to locate and find the continent of South America and then label the countries which are part of it, located and naming the surrounding oceans and using compass directions to describe where to find each country. Wow real Geographers!!
