EYFS & Year 1 Classes

EYFS/Year 1 have kicked off this term's enquiry with some special visitors! As historians, they thought about what they would like to find out about technology in the past and wrote some questions that they wanted to ask.

They loved welcoming in their grandparents to learn what technology was like when they were children. They learned a lot and were able to look at some old technology to see how it has changed.

As scientists they looked at the properties of different materials and sorted them into groups. They also looked at materials being 'human made' or 'natural'.

Last week, they enjoyed being able to get out in the little bit of sunshine we have had this term!

Some highlights were practising teamwork and building strength on the bikes and making some lovely pictures with the hammers and shapes!

Next term, they are looking forward to their next enquiry question when they can learn about animals on their trip to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm.



Year 2 Classes

This term as part of their enquiry 'Who were the Victorians?' Year 2 have been learning about how the village of Uphill has changed since the Victorian era. They were so lucky to have historian Michael Gorley from Historic England to take them on a tour of the village. He shared lots of really interesting facts about our local area and its history, which has really helped their understanding of





Victorian life.

Year 2 had a brilliant day on their educational trip to the SS Great Britain in Bristol. They witnessed maritime history and learned all about the way the Victorians

built this great ship. Pupils were transported back in time to experience firsthand the realities of life as both workers and passengers aboard the legendary vessel. They also had the unique opportunity to don authentic Victorian clothes and bring the pages of history to life.

In PE they have been joined by Dom from Somerset Cricket. He has been helping them to learn a variety of cricket skills. Last

week they got to put all these skills into practice with a game of cricket.

We think we may have some budding cricketers in Year 2!





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Year 3 & 4 Classes

As scientists they have been able to name all the different food groups and sorted which foods belonged where. They took their learning one step further by describing the main nutrients that the food types provide! Wow, that's great knowledge Year 3/4. As classes, they also investigated the food pyramid and discussed what the

purpose of each group is.

As writers they have loved being creative and using their imaginations to design a ship and have started to learn about persuasive devices, ready to write an advert for their ship creations.

At the beginning of the week, they researched the ship that the Tulane family travelled on; the RMS Queen Mary.

They were researchers and found out lots of information which they shared with our

As scientists, Year 5 and 6 have really enjoyed exploring forces using a range of equipment that pushes, pulls and twists. It was lovely to see them all having a go and getting to grips with the principles involved.





As gymnasts, they have been focussing on being creative as they practise balances and moves to use in a gymnastic

sequence- they worked effectively with a partner to produce a gymnastic sequence to share with the rest of the class.

It was a real pleasure to receive a visit from Megan who is a cyber-protection officer for Avon & Somerset Police. They learnt and discussed how to keep themselves safe online as well as be aware of age-appropriate gaming and video watching.

These are really important skills to learn at this age & we are very proud of the way Year 5/6 took this learning very seriously.
