



As historians, they thought about what they would like to find out about technology in the past and wrote some questions that they wanted to ask. They loved welcoming in grandparents to learn what technology was like when they were children. They learned a lot and were able to look at some old technology to see how it has changed.

#### Year 2 Classes

This term as part of their enquiry 'Who were the Victorians?' Year 2 have been learning about how the village of Uphill has changed since the Victorian era. He shared lots of really interesting facts about our local area and its history, which

As, tragically, the earthquakes in Turkey unfolded, we were


