### Benefit Related Free School Meals

If your income or circumstances have changed and you feel your child(ren) may be eligible for benefit related free school meals, please apply now to check eligibility.

Those parents of children in our EYFS cohort should check eligibility as there are many more benefits than just free school meals, which your child will already receive under the universal infant free school meals system.

An application should be made for each individual child; as siblings will not automatically qualify.

Even if you have a younger child who qualifies for Universal Free School Meals (Yr R-2), it is important to check if you are eligible for benefit related Free school meals to enable you to receive financial support from the school towards the cost of trips, milk, jumpers/cardigans and KS2 music lessons.

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

### What have we been up to this term?

#### EYFS & Year 1 - Rainbow, Sunshine & Saturn Classes

We are so proud of our EYFS/Y1 children who showed great courage, enthusiasm and talent performing their nativity 'Donkey for Sale' to two appreciative audiences. You were brilliant and a joy to watch!



EYFS have enjoyed doing lots of other wintery crafts to help develop their fine motor skills such as making paper chains, snowflakes and weaving baubles. A sunny day back in November was perfect for EYFS to get the bikes and scooters out and practise their balancing.

As mathematicians year 1 practised subtracting using the counting back method. They problem solved subtraction using pennies falling out of a pocket!





Well done EYFS & Year 1 you have really settled in well this term!

#### Year 2 - Pluto & Jupiter Classes

Year 2 have learned so much this term!

As mathematicians year 2 have been adding and subtracting two digit numbers and exchanging tens. They used counters to show how we exchange a ten.

As geographers, they had an exciting field trip exploring Uphill / WsM coastline from the top of the hill. They looked at the human features that they could see as well as examining the topography.





As scientists, year 2 have been investigating liquids; how they move and if they all moved/can be poured like water. They predicted then tested this out by timing to see how fast liquids went down a slope. They found there were slower liquids than water. The Carol Concert at St Nicholas Church was a huge success, I am sure you will agree. The Year 2's all sang beautifully. We are so proud of them.



#### **Forest School**

Forest School have been out and about learning from our natural environment. Here they are searching for creatures that live on the woodland floor. They spent time collecting, identifying and classifying. At the start of October the children enjoyed making environmental art trails across the grounds of our school.

#### Year 3 & 4 - Sputnik, Chandra & Voyager Classes

Our Year 3/4 pupils have been busy this year. As writers they have been writing a non-chron report all about Viking Gods and Goddesses. To start their learning journey they read an information report and identified features using their rubrics, which showed their success criteria as writers.





As mathematicians they investigated and explored arrays. They used arrays to help them understand and 'see' their times tables.

As linguists, year 3/4 learned French words for the rooms in their houses. They practised these together and then used them to create their own 'dream houses'.

And as scientists, they learned all about magnets and their magnetic fields. They predicted and tested which materials would be magnetic or not.
