#### EYFS & Year 1 - Rainbow, Sunshine & Saturn Classes



We are so proud of our EYFS/Y1 children who showed great courage, enthusiasm and talent performing their nativity to two appreciative audiences. You were brilliant and a joy to watch!

This is the first time many of the children have performed in front of an audience and they were great; we are so proud of them!

EYFS have enjoyed doing lots of other wintery crafts to help develop their fine motor skills such as making Christmas wreaths and weaving





As mathematicians year 1 practised subtracting using the counting back method whilst our EYFS children explored money using their class shop!

As readers they have all expanded the learning from the story 'Stickman' by Julia Donaldson; learning different techniques to retell the story including creating story boards, making puppets and drawing the characters.

As scientists they have focussed on magnets, learning scientific language such as repel, attract, north pole and south pole.

Well done EYFS & Year 1 your learning has been spectacular and you have really settled in well this



## Year 2 - Pluto & Jupiter Classes

Year 2 have learned so much this term!

As mathematicians year 2 have been adding and subtracting two digit numbers and exchanging tens. They used counters to show how we exchange a ten. As citizens, they were learning about the difference between bullying and unwanted behaviours; this fitted in great to the learning during Anti Bullying Week. The made paper chains to demonstrate how people linked together, working to stop bullying.



Year 2 have really worked hard on their writing this term, examining and identifying features of a letter. When they had learnt how to build a letter they were busy writing their own - Wow Year 2 that is a great skill to learn!

Last week, we're sure you will agree, the Carol Service at St Nicholas Church was a huge success. The Year 2's spoke clearly, signed beautifully and sang with such joy. You were an absolute delight to watch and we hope your parents enjoyed it as much as we did.

We are so proud of them.

























## What have we being up to this term? continued...

#### Year 3 & 4 - Sputnik, Chandra & Voyager Classes



As mathematicians they have recapped learning the column method of adding and subtracting as this masters and embeds the skills they need for almost every maths problem they will encounter. We are really pleased with how well they have recalled this knowledge and used it effectively.

#### Year 5 & 6 - Pegasus, Orion & Unicorn Classes

Year 5/6 have certainly hit the ground running this year; their pace of work is exceptional!

Term 2 started with rehearsing their Remembrance poems; learning about choral poetry. They performed their poems to the rest of the school in the assembly before Remembrance Sunday. Our year 6 House & Vice Captains, accompanied by Mrs Beal, represented the Academy at the Uphill Village Service on the hill, whilst at school, the children respectfully took part in a collective two minute silence during our special Remembrance Day assembly.

As historians, years 5/6 have learnt about the Egyptians; their Gods, their way of life and their food. They ended term 1 with a visit from Egyptian Ali for a whole days workshop about Ancient Egypt.
