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Allergen Reminder

Uphill Village Academy is a nut aware school. It is really important that that children do not have any nuts or nut products in their packed lunches.

This includes but is not exclusive to:

- Peanut butter and Nutella spread sandwiches
- Cereal bars containing nuts or traces of nuts
 - Products containing sesame seeds

For the safety of children with allergies within our school, items of food containing nuts may need to be removed from a child. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

We also need to remind parents that unfortunately we cannot accept any homemade food products such as cakes that are intended to be shared with children in school i.e. birthday cakes, biscuits etc. The only items we allow to be shared with other children within the same class to celebrate a birthday are sealed bags or individually wrapped sweets. These will be handed out as children leave school to enable permission to be given by a parent.

We would encourage parents to not give any sweet products for their child to share for birthdays.

Play Equipment

The play equipment in the front playground is for use by EYFS & Year 1 pupils, under supervision, during the school day.

Please **do not** allow your child(ren) to play on this equipment at collection time. Parents are requested to collect their child and leave the premises as quickly as possible through the side gates. Please refrain from waiting in the playground areas.

Your co-operation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Recently, we have had a number of children bringing fidget/fiddle toys into school.

Please can we remind parents that children should not bring any toys from home into the academy, including Breakfast club and After School club.

Unfortunately, any toys bought into school will be confiscated and returned to the child at the end of the school day.

Last year it funded the construction of the new bike shelter and this year we will be using the funds to help design a wild flower area on the field to attract even more nature.




