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Changes to Penalty Notices

We wanted to bring your attention to the update in the statutory guidance for schools that comes into effect from 19th August 2024. In summary the changes are as follows:

- Be clearer on the link between improving attendance and wider school culture, including the importance of working in partnership with families to find supportive routes to improve attendance.
- Reflect changes to the law on keeping school attendance and admission registers
- Set out the new National Framework for issuing penalty notices and reflect changes to the law introduced through the Education (Penalty Notices) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2024.
- Change 'parenting contracts' for attendance to 'attendance contracts' to better reflect the agreement between parents, schools and/or local authorities.

All of the changes in legislation are reflected in our Attendance Policy which can be found on our website from 19th August www.uphillvillageacademy.co.uk

We have also emailed a leaflet from North Somerset Council reflecting the changes in Penalty Notice legislation.

Holiday season is upon us and we do understand the temptation to take your child out of school during term time either before or after the summer break. However, we ask that you carefully consider this choice and avoid doing so.

Attending school every day helps children maximise their learning in the classroom and enjoy the benefits of their entire educational experience. We ask parents to request permission for any leave of absence in advance, which must be in writing and, wherever possible, at least **four weeks'** notice should be provided. We may ask to meet with you to discuss your request.

Parents are reminded that unauthorised absence may result in the receipt of a Penalty Notice and/or, in certain circumstances, being liable to prosecution.

Ensuring children attend school every available day, on time, is a key parental responsibility and your support in this matter is greatly appreciated.

End of Year ParentPay

Parents of Year 6 Children - Important Information

Over the next few weeks we will be moving any credit or outstanding debt within a Year 6 child's account to their siblings account, if available.

If there are no siblings within school, any outstanding debt MUST be settled by **21st July**. Please ensure there is sufficient credit to cover school meals required until the end of term. If there is a credit remaining on your child's account at the end oft term, we will contact you with instructions for how to claim a refund through the CLF Finance department.

Year 6 After School Club & Breakfast Club fees for July will be charged to your child's ParentPay account this week and should be paid in full before the end of term.

All Other Year Groups

Any child currently attending school and having school dinners in July must have enough credit within their account to cover the costs. Please remember to top up your account at the end of August to cover any meal costs in September. All balances MUST remain in credit at all times.

Parents of children within Year 2 should be aware that the entitlement for Universal Infant Free School Meals will cease and school meals will be charged to ParentPay at a cost of £2.40 per meal on their return in September.







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KS2 Milk Orders 2024-25

From September 2024 we will no longer be able to support the purchase of milk for Key Stage 2 children.

School Milk Services will no longer take orders for milk once a child moves into Key Stage 2 (yrs 3-6). We will also not, as a school, provide children with milk once a child is in KS2.

This does not affect our EYFS and KS1 (yrs 1 & 2) children.

We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Children should always have a water bottle in school on each and every day and are welcome to bring in a small juice carton &/or a piece of fruit to
