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


What have we been up to this term?

EYFS & Year 1 - Rainbow, Sunshine & Saturn Classes

EYFS and Year 1 have been hard at work. They have made real progress with their learning and phonics. Well done and keep up the good work!

At the beginning of term 1, they enjoyed a lovely walk around Uphill as geographers. The children looked out for physical & human features in Uphill and spotted so many things, they really enjoyed this fieldwork and exploring the local area.





This is the first time many of the children have performed in front of an audience and they were brilliant, we are so proud of them!





Next term, EYFS/Year 1 move onto their next enquiry question, 'How has Uphill changed over time?' Well done EYFS & Year 1 you have really settled in so well this term!



Year 2 - Pluto & Jupiter Classes

Year 2 have learned so much this term!

They have completed their enquiry question 'Where in the World Are We?'; learning about the geographical features of Uphill, Weston and the surrounding area and comparing this with Shanghai, China! Their learning culminated in a



walk up the hill to spot the landmarks of Weston-super-Mare.



Both classes have been really active in PE and have worked hard at practicsng their balance skills on a range of apparatus. They also took part in a Target Practice Festival with Somerset Sports, where the children completed five activities to be placed in a league table with other North Somerset schools. Everyone rose to the challenge and had great fun.



For their presentation of learning, at the end of the term, the children invited year 3 & 4 pupils to see their work and enjoyed sharing their knowledge.

For Christmas, our Year 2 children performed their Christmas Service at St Nicholas Church. There were songs and readings and Christmas hats galore! They were brilliant! It was great to see so many parents and families come along to watch them perform.







Reception recommendation:


Year 2 recommendation:




Year 4 recommendation:


