Sustrans Big Walk & Wheel



Last year, you may remember us taking part in the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel with the aim of encouraging us all to get active on our journeys to and from school.

Well, this year it is back.!

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel inspires pupils to make active journeys to school, improve air quality in their neighbourhood and discover how these changes benefit their world.

On each day of the challenge, schools compete to see who can get the highest percentage of their pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school with a chance of winning prizes for their school.

It is the UK's largest inter-school walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It aims to inspire hundreds of thousands of pupils to get active on the school run.

This year's challenge will take place from Monday 20th March to 31st March 2023.

Please encourage your child(ren) to think about how you could walk, scoot or cycle to school over the next two weeks. Here a reminder of last year's result
