Family Lateral Flow

Regular testing of people without symptoms (asymptomatic testing) is important to help stop the spread of the virus. Secondary school pupils, and primary and secondary school staff, will take twice weekly tests using home test kits provided by their school.

However, from 1 March 2021, if you're a member of a household, a childcare bubble or a support bubble of a member of school staff or a school pupil you can also access asymptomatic testing.

- At a local test site. You can take a rapid lateral flow test at a local site. Testing at these sites is assisted, which means you will swab yourself under the supervision of a trained operator. You may need to book an appointment. The nearest test centre is Hutton Moor Leisure Centre.
- By collecting a home test kit from a collection site. You can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point and each pack contains 7 tests. Anyone 18 or over can collect. The nearest collection site is Locking Road Car Park
- By ordering a home test kit online. If you cannot get tested at your workplace, or are unable to go to a test site or collect test kits, you can order a home test kit online. Do not order online if you can get a test through other methods. Visit https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid- lateral-flow-tests to order.
