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# Message from the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers,

As you may already be aware, we have recently had an increase in positive Covid-19 cases in school. This has affected specific classes and, following guidance from North Somerset health protection team, parents of these classes have been asked to undertake daily LFD tests on their child (ren) for a period of 7 days. We are continuing to monitor case levels and work with the health protection team to prevent the spread of infection within school.

I would like to thank you all for your support with this and for adhering to current guidance, particularly around isolation, testing and reporting of results. Please do not hesitate to contact the school office if you have any concerns or questions.

There has been lots going over the last two weeks! Our Year 5/6 classes visited Caerleon in Wales in support of their Romans learning. Year 3/4 classes took part in a talk with a nurse from Weston General Hospital, supporting their science learning and our Year 5/6 classes had an assembly delivered by Kooth, the online mental health platform.

### **Attendance Policy**

We have a new Attendance Policy that will be available on our website from next week. We would recommend parents/carers take some time to read the policy to understand how the academy manages children's attendance and parents/carers responsibilities surrounding their child's attendance in school. In the last newsletter we shared our expectations regarding term time leave which we encourage families to refer to again. Other key pieces of information from the policy are:

- We expect our children to achieve at least 97% attendance throughout the year. Parents/Carers of those children who fall below this level (excluding covid absence) will be informed of this on a regular basis. For those children with repeated attendance issues we will work with the family to provide support and plans to improve attendance.
- If a child needs to attend a medical appointment this should be arranged outside of school time. If the appointment is within school time parents must provide evidence in the form of an appointment card or letter. If no medical evidence is forthcoming, the absence will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.
- Children should arrive on time to school. We do understand that on occasions things happen and children arrive late, however this should not be a regular occurrence. Children arriving late are recorded as so in the register and cases of continual lateness are referred to the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) for further action. Please ensure your child arrives promptly for school.

Half Term	Whole School Competition	Decorate a wooden spoon with clues as to what character/ book it is. Take a photo of the spoon with the book you have chosen.
Monday 28 <sup>th</sup> February	Launch of reading week	Assembly for Reading Week. Each class will learn a poem throughout the week to perform to the rest of the school
Tuesday 1st March	Bed time stories in your virtual classes	Children are invited to snuggle up at home and sign in to their Teams account to enjoy a bedtime story with their class teacher.  This will be at 5:30pm for EYFS/KS1 and 6:00pm for KS2.
Wednesday 2nd March	Class Activities	Children will be completing activities that explore their poem and practising their performance. Performances will be recorded at the end of the week
Thursday 3rd March	Teacher swap!	Teachers will visit another class to read a story for 15minutes.
Thursday 3rd March	World Book Day	All children are invited to come to school dressed as their favourite book character for the day. Please do not go and buy a special outfit, home made outfits are perfectly adequate.  Please can they also bring their favourite book to school to share with others.
Thursday 3rd March	Stop and Read Day	On World Book Day, at different times during the day, the bell will ring and children and adults will stop what they are doing and read for 5-10 minutes. Make sure your child has their favourite book in school on this day!
