Dear Parents/Carers.

Important Food Reminder

Uphill Village Academy is a nut aware school.

Please ensure that children do not have any nuts or nut products in their packed lunches or within any snacks they have at breaktimes.

This includes;

Peanut butter or Nutella spread within sandwiches

Cereal bars or biscuits containing nuts or sesame seeds. Allergic reactions to nuts can be very serious and for the safety of other children, items of food containing nut may need to be removed from a child. Everyone's co-operation in this matter is very much appreciated

Bonfire Night Safety

Sparklers

- Supervise children using sparklers and follow instructions on the packaging.
- Light sparklers one at a time.
- Wear gloves and keep sparklers at arm's length.
- You can put the end of a sparkler in a carrot, making it safer to hold.
- Put used sparklers in a bucket of water.

Fireworks

- Only buy fireworks marked with the British Safety Standard: 7114 or CE safety mark.
- Store safely in a closed box out of children's
- Light fireworks at arm's length and stand well back.
- Never return to a lit firework: if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.

Parking Concerns

We have had a number of complaints from our local residents regarding the parking of vehicles on the roads around the village at drop off and collection

We are asking all parents, that drive their child(ren) to and from school, to please be mindful of our neighbours.

There are particular issues on St Nicholas Road, opposite the school and Ellesmere Road, at the side of the school. Please do NOT park on the grass verges or on the corner of St Nicholas Road leading onto Old Church Road. Be mindful of not blocking driveways or making it difficult for cars to exit their own driveways because cars are parked without consideration.

The North Somerset Council Parking Enforcement Officers and Avon & Somerset Police are regularly visiting the village at drop off and collection times and will issue fixed penalty notices.
