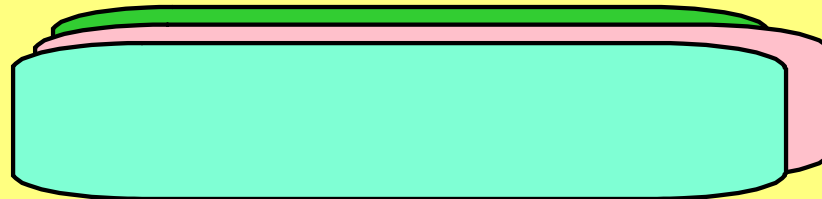

**Exclamation** Using how or what at the beginning and ending with a exclamation mark.

**Command** Giving an instruction. Telling someone to do something.
