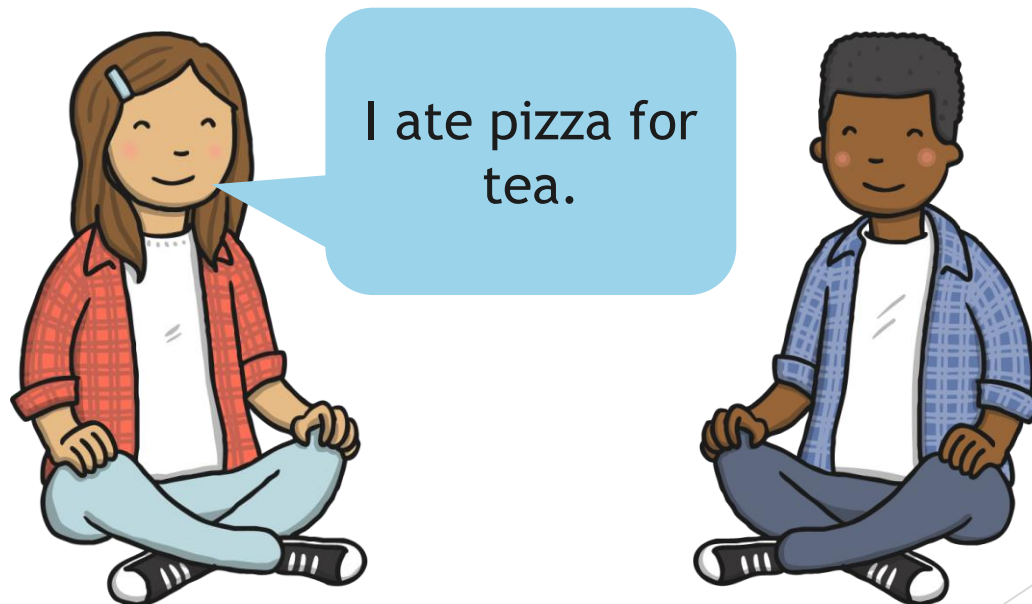


Progressive Tenses

Past and present tense in the progressive form.

In this lesson we are going to learn about a slightly different form of the past and present tenses.

- ▶ It is called the Progressive form and is used to describe actions that are or were happening.

Another way of saying this is that they were (or are) in progress.

This is where we get the name Progressive from.



Past and present tense in the progressive form.

- ▶ Past: Yesterday I went for a walk.
- ▶ Past Progressive: Yesterday I went walking.
- ▶ Past: He tied his shoelace.
- ▶ Past Progressive: He was tying his shoelace.

Past and present tense in the progressive form.



- ▶ Present: I am out for a walk.
- ▶ Present Progressive: I am out walking.
- ▶ Present: I am sat at home.
- ▶ Present Progressive: I am sitting at home.





















The biggest clue!

- ▶ Look for the 'ing'.
- ▶ If it is saying something is happening even if its in the past it is the progressive form.
