
Reading Recommendations @ Uphill Village Academy





Name: Edie Age: 10




Name: Macie Age: 11

Name: Sky Cox Age: 11 Book name: Love Frankie






Name: Ava Age: 11



The main character is a boy named Greg and his appetite goes with the name of the book "diary of a wimpy kid".






